



RESOLUTION NO. 2012-#89

**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RIVERSIDE AUTHORIZING A
RESOLUTION TO RENEW MEMBERSHIP IN THE SOUTHERN NEW JERSEY
REGIONAL EMPLOYEE BENEFITS FUND**

WHEREAS, a number of public entities in the State of New Jersey have joined together to form the **Southern New Jersey Regional Employee Benefits Fund**, hereafter referred to as "FUND," as permitted by N.J.S.A. 11:15-3, 17:1-8.1, and 40A:10-36 et seq., and;

WHEREAS, the FUND was approved to become operational by the Departments of Insurance and Community Affairs and has been operational since that date, and;

WHEREAS, the statutes and regulations governing the creation and operation of a joint insurance fund, contain certain elaborate restrictions and safeguards concerning the safe and efficient administration of the public interest entrusted to such a FUND;

WHEREAS, the governing body of **Riverside Township**, hereinafter referred to as "LOCAL UNIT" has determined that membership in the FUND is in the best interest of the LOCAL UNIT.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the governing body of the LOCAL UNIT hereby agrees as follows:

- i. Become a member of the FUND for the period outlined in the LOCAL UNIT's Indemnity and Trust Agreements.
- ii. Will participate in the following type (s) of coverage (s):
 - a.) Health Insurance as defined pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17B:17-4, the FUND's Bylaws, and Plan of Risk Management.
- iii. Adopts and approves the FUND's Bylaws.
- iv. Execute an application for membership and any accompanying certifications.

construed as an obligation of the LOCAL UNIT for claims and expenses that are not covered by the FUND, or for that portion of any claim or liability within the LOCAL UNIT retained limit or in an amount which exceeds the FUND's limit of coverage.

6. If the FUND in the enforcement of any part of this Agreement shall incur necessary expenses or become obligated to pay attorney's fees and/or court costs, the LOCAL UNIT agrees to reimburse the FUND for all such reasonable expenses, fees, and costs on demand.

7. The LOCAL UNIT and the FUND agree that the FUND shall hold all moneys in excess of the LOCAL UNIT's retained loss fund paid by the LOCAL UNIT to the FUND as fiduciaries for the benefit of FUND claimants all in accordance with N.J.A.C. 11:15-3 et. seq.

8. The FUND shall establish and maintain Claims Trust Accounts for the payment of health insurance claims in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:10-36 et. seq., N.J.S.A. 40A:5-1 and such other statutes and regulations as may be applicable. More specifically, the aforementioned Trust Accounts shall be utilized solely for the payment of claims, allocated claim expense and stop loss insurance or reinsurance premiums for each risk or liability as follows:


- a) Employer contributions to group health insurance
- b) Employee contributions to contributory group health insurance
- c) Employer contributions to contingency account
- d) Employee contributions to contingency account
- e) Other trust accounts as required by the Commissioner of Insurance


9. Notwithstanding 8 above, to the contrary, the FUND shall not be required to establish separate trust accounts for employee contributions provided the FUND provides a plan in its Bylaws for the recording and accounting of employee contributions of each member.

10. Each LOCAL UNIT of government who shall become a member of the FUND shall be obligated to execute an Indemnity and Trust Agreement similar to this Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Township has identified certain blocks and lots, as a public nuisance due to failure to maintain the property; and



The amount so charged shall forthwith become a lien upon such lands and shall be added to and become and form a part of the taxes next to be assessed and levied upon such lands, the same to bear interest at the same rate as taxes, and shall be collected and enforced by the same officers and in the same manner as taxes; and

WHEREAS, the Township has identified the attached blocks and lots as abandoned properties as of September 2011.

WHEREAS, the Township has abated the conditions and hereby places the cost of abatement as a lien against the attached blocks and lots in the amounts shown.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of the Township of Riverside approves such action.

Whereas, the "West Avenue Trails at the Dunes" were created on the site of a municipal compost facility as passive parkland which will primarily be used as paths and trails; and,

Whereas, the Township of Riverside shares Delanco's concerns that the Dunes have been listed as a potential site for the dumping of dredge spoils from the Delaware River by the US Army Corps of Engineers and by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection; and,

Whereas, as the Township of Riverside supports the "West Avenue Trails at the Dunes" and as the Township of Riverside has concerns about the impacts the dumping of dredge spoils could have on the Township as well as surrounding municipalities, the Township of Riverside officially opposes the dumping of dredge spoils at the Dunes;


Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Township Committee of the Township of Riverside that:

COMMITTEE REPORTS:**DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY:**

Chief Tursi reported the Police Activity for August 2012: Investigations – 162, Adult Arrests Total – 112, Motor Vehicle Summons – 166, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 6, Juvenile Charges – 15, Curfew Violations – 2, Protective Custody – 0, Domestic Violence Cases – 13, Summons for False Alarms – 0, False Alarm Calls - 20. Chief Tursi reported the various trainings that the Officers attended, the various programs that the officers and the Chief participated in, and various awards and commendations that the police officers received. A copy of the report is on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

Mayor Conard reported the Delran Emergency Squad Activity for August 2012: Medical Emergencies – 90, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 3, Fire Stand Bys – 5, Non Emergency Transports – 0, Patients transported to the hospital – 75 and Patients refused treatment and transportation – 18.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS:

Mrs. Hatcher reported that the Public Works Department performed road maintenance throughout the Township, chipped branches every Monday and Friday, cut the grass at all parks and Township owned lots and ball fields. The Friday morning sweeps are still ongoing, grass clippings are still being collected in bags every 2nd and 4th Wednesday of the month, the last pick up will be on September 26th. The Department painted the curbs and crosswalks in the school area and is currently working on hauling leaf compost to a recycling facility in Palmyra. The activities for October 2012 were reported. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND FINANCE:

Mr. Van Meter reported that the third quarter tax bills were mailed out on July 25, 2012 and should have been paid by August 31, 2012. Delinquent tax bills were sent out approximately September 5, 2012. The 2012 fourth quarter reconciled tax bills should be out by September 30th. The fourth quarter tax is due on November 1st and interest will accrue on November 13th.

DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION:

Mr. Prisco reported that the Riverside Youth Athletic Association has agreed to background checks and fingerprinting.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EVENTS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:

Mrs. Hatcher requested Administrator Jack to give the Public Events report. Administrator Jack reported that Community Day will be held on September 29, 2012 from 9:00am – 2:00pm. The Police and Fire Departments will be participating, the Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts will be participating also. There will be a maze made out of hay, possibly face painting and numerous vendors. Flyers advertising this will be sent to the Riverside School District for distribution.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT:

Solicitor Saponaro had no report.

MUNICIPAL CLERK'S REPORT:

Municipal Clerk Dydek reported that as of today's date, 815 dog licenses have been issued and 73 cat licenses have been issued. A Raffle License Application has been received from the Riverside Elementary School and is currently being processed. The General and School Elections will be held on Tuesday November 6, 2012 and the last day to register to vote is October 16, 2012.

Mrs. Dydek reported on the Vital Statistics Report for the first half of 2012: Birth Certificate Applicants – 136, Marriage Certificate Applicants – 47, Death Certificate Applicants (non EDRS) – 2, Electronic Death Certificates Filed (EDRS) – 40, Domestic Partnership Applicants – 0, Civil Union Applicants – 0, Marriage Licenses Issued – 26, Births of Riverside residents – 45, Deaths of Riverside residents – 34.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Mayor Conard asked the Committee if there were any questions regarding the Engineer's Report that was submitted. No questions were presented. A copy of the report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's office.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

Administrator Jack reported that additional inlet problems have been identified on Heulings Avenue between New Jersey Avenue and Second Street and on Washington Street at Fairview Street and on Sylvan Street at Pine Street. The contracts have been executed for the Phase VI Project which includes the 400 and 500 blocks of Filmore Street, the for a mill/overlay, the 500 block of Jefferson for a reconstruction, the 600 block of Jefferson for a mill/overlay, and the 200-300 blocks of Madison for reconstruction. The Engineer is scheduling preconstruction meeting and the Township will also schedule a date for a meeting with residents on those streets.

PUBLIC PORTION


Mayor Conard opened the Public Portion.

- 1) **Mr. Joe Dimiero - Chester Avenue**, stated his concerns regarding the debris that is being left by tractor trailer trucks that are entering Simon and Shuster from Chester Avenue. Mr. Dimiero stated that there is a great amount of sand left in the street by the trucks. Also, a truck has knocked over a telephone pole. Mr. Dimiero submitted pictures to the Township showing a tremendous amount of sand being left in the street by the trucks and the large amount of trucks being parked on Simon and Shuster's property. Mayor Conard requested that Administrator Jack set up a meeting with Delran Township to discuss this problem. Administrator Jack addressed Mr. Dimiero and reviewed his concerns and stated that she will inform him of the outcome of the meeting with Delran Township..
- 2) **Ms. Deborah Fra - 117 South Chester Avenue**, stated her concerns over the huge quantity of tractor trailer trucks that are using the Simon and Shuster driveway apron on Chester Avenue. Ms. Fra stated that because of the amount of trucks, she believes that there are health concerns. Ms. Fra also stated that she has witnessed the trucks crossing the double yellow lines to be able to get into the driveway. Ms. Fra stated that the residents cannot back out of their own driveways because of the amount of sand that is blown onto their property; their cars cannot get traction to drive out of the driveway. Ms. Fra also stated her concerns regarding the noise. Administrator Jack informed Ms. Fra to call the Police when she witnesses the noise or other motor vehicle violations.
- 3) **Mr. Jon Piere Fra - 117 Chester Avenue**, said that besides all the concerns that were previously addressed by the residents regarding the tractor trailers using the Simon and Shuster Chester Avenue driveway apron, the doors of the trailers are left open when the drivers are not in their trucks. Teenagers eat pizza in the trailer and leave pizza and debris on the residents' property. Mayor Conard reiterated to Administrator Jack to contact the Mayor of Delran Township concerning all the complaints and concerns that were presented tonight about the tractor trailer activity.
- 4) **Steven Lohr, Colgate Avenue, Delanco, New Jersey** - Thanked the Committee for their support in passing a Resolution supporting the Dunes of Delanco.
- 5) **Ms. Christine Martinez, Cleveland Avenue** - said that she submitted a letter for review requesting permission for her husband to park his tractor trailer in the Public Parking lot for a brief time when he is home from his driving job. Ms. Martinez also stated that the Middle School needs a Port - O - Pot at Whomsley Field. Administrator Jack stated that she is currently getting quotes for the Port - O - Pot. Mayor Conard addressed the Administrator to give the Middle School the keys to the bathrooms and the Middle School will be responsible for the bathrooms at the times the Middle School uses the bathrooms.
- 6) **Ms. Barbara Mc Fadden, 634 Adams Street**, stated her extreme displeasure that Adams Street is not being repaved and other streets in the area are. Ms. Mc Fadden explained that Adams Street is in dire need of repair. Administrator Jack explained that the cost of the project would have increased greatly if Adams Street was included in the project. The reason that Jefferson Street is included in the project is because the street

only needs an overlay, unlike the vast amount of work that Adams Street would require to repair it.

Hearing nothing further from the Public, motion made by Mr. Van Meter and Mrs. Hatcher carried: Public Portion be closed.

There being no further business to attend to, motion made by Mr. Van Meter and Mr. Prisco that the meeting be adjourned, and so declared by Mayor Conard.
