The regular meeting of the Riverside Sewerage Authority was held on the above date at the Riverside Township Municipal Building 1 W. Scott Street Riverside, NJ 08075.

ROLL CALL

Also present: Authority Secretary Susan M. Dydek, Treasurer Meghan Jack, Superintendent Joseph Bader and Assistant Superintendent Jeffrey Conard.

RESOLUTIONS:

Mr. Horton made a motion to adopt Resolution 2018-#21 entitled, "A RESOLUTION OF THE RIVERSIDE SEWERAGE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE DONATION OF TWO (2) VEHICLES TO THE TOWNSHIP OF RIVERSIDE" seconded by Mr. Mingin. Mr. Conard reported that the Primary Digester Mixer Upgrade Project is near completion.

APPEALS:

Mr. Mingin had no report.

REVENUE AND FINANCE:

Mr. Haman had no report.

STREETS:

Mr. Van Meter had no report.

INSPECTIONS:

Mr. Horton reported that vent pipe repair was done at a house on Fairview Street.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Superintendent Bader reported that the property owner at 24 Scott Street was issued a letter requiring him to repair a damaged lateral vent cap for the property. The SCADA communication issue with the Dialer has been rectified. The Dialer will now notify personnel when an alarm is generated from the SCADA System. An emergency condition occurred at the Hooker Street Pump Station on April 23, 2018. Employees discovered motor oil on top of the Wet Well when they responded to a High Water Alarm. The Engineer requested the DRBC for an extension in submitting the 2017 Annual PMP Plan Report. The Hooker Street Pump Station had a power outage on May 5, 2018 and the portable generator was connected.

The report is on file in the Authority Secretary's Office.

Assistant Superintendent Jeffrey Conard reported that the Confined Space Retrieval System was upgraded. Mr. Conard also reported that two (2) dead trees need to be removed. The trees are near the baseball field. Mr. Conard successfully obtained his C3 Collection License.

Motion made by Mr. Van Meter, seconded by Mr. Mingin to accept the Superintendent's Report carried.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

The Engineer's Report was submitted.

RIVERSIDE SEWERAGE AUTHORITY PLANT OPERATOR'S REPORT AUTHORITY MEETING - May 9, 2018

- 1. The Plant Performance Summary for March, 2018 is attached for review. There were no violations during this reporting period. The Residuals [Sludge] Management Summary for March, 2018 is also attached for review. Dewatered sludge [50 yds] was removed by the Woolston Company for composting at the County facility. Sludge processing with the Belt Filter Press has increased due to the Primary Digester being out of service.
- March 1, 2018 the addition of liquid Caustic Soda to the Secondary Clarifiers was implemented to meet the NJDEP permit for the Plants Effluent. The NJDEP's permitted effluent pH requirement is a 6 pH. The addition of the Caustic Soda has continued and the Plant's Effluent has been within the NJDEP's permitted requirements as of the writing of this report. The Nitrification Tower appears to be operating as designed as of the writing of this report.

The LCS (Laboratory Control Standard) for the Influent and Effluent BOD 5 composite collected March 7, 2018 was out of range. A BOD 5 with a LCS outside of acceptance range means the result must be reported with a CODE=E on NPDES reports. The result is therefore, reported as invalid on the NPDES reports. A makeup Influent and Effluent BOD5 Composite was taking March 28, 2018 to meet the NJDEP permit requirements.

2. The Trouble Log Summary for April, 2018 is attached for review.

Three Properties were reported to the NJDEP for a lateral vent overflow this reporting period.

- a. 311 Fairview Street. NJDEP Case #180412152147.
- b. 213 Delaware Avenue. NJDEP Case #180417215805.
- c. 140 Grant Street. NJDEP Case #180418085229.

The Property Owner for 24 Scott Street was issued a letter April 9, 2018 requiring the owner to repair a damaged lateral vent cap for the property. The Owner had seven days to make the repairs and notify the Superintendent once the letter was received. A signed receipt for the letter was received, which was dated for April13, 2018 of the reception of the letter. The Township Administrator was notified as of April 18, 2018 the Owner of 24 Scott had not made the required repairs as directed. The Property Owner had until April 20, 2018 to do so. The Township Administrator informed me the Township Inspector will notify the Property Owner the repairs need to be completed or the owner will receive fines from the Township. The repairs have been completed

- 3. There is no Line Maintenance Summary for April, 2018 attached for review. No Collection System Maintenance was performed in April.
- 4. Measurements taking on May 12, 2018 for the Secondary Digester are North 32 1/2", South 37", East 34", and West 37". There is a 5 1/2" tilt to the digester cover currently.

[The Secondary Digester is not operating as designed. The Secondary Digester Dome requires methane gas produced in the Primary Digester for the secondary roof to float correctly. Until the repairs to the Primary Digester mixing system are made, the digester won't produce enough gas to lift the Secondary Digester Dome roof].

- 5. The Activities Report for April/May 2018 is attached for review.
- 6. The SCADA communication issue with the Dialer has been rectified. The Dialer will now notify personal when an alarm is generated from the SCADA system.
- 7. The SED Utilization Report for March 2018 and the SED First Quarter Procurement Report for 2018 were submitted by email to the NJDEP's Office of Equal Opportunity and Public Contract Assistance with compliance to the Primary Digester Mixing Project. A confirmation of receipt was received April 12, 2018.
- 8. Clyde Lattimer & Son Construction and a representative for the supplier of the Primary Digester Roto Mix system were onsite to conduct a pre Startup Test run of the system. The Mixing system performed as designed. The completion of a punch list, the second mixing system startup using the Raw Primary Sludge and personal training on the system still remains. The Pennoni Associates anticipated in service date for the Primary Digester of May 2, 2018 will not be reached. The Contract ending date was May 11, 2018. [The NJDEP out of service case #is 171206092456]:
- 9. An emergency condition existed at the Hooker Street Pump Station April 23, 2018. Employees discovered Motor Oil on top the Wet Well when responding to a High Water Alarm. [The NJDEP Case # is 180423151214]. The NJDEP Southern Enforcement Inspector was also notified.
 The Motor Oil that was discovered in the Wet Well when responding to a High Water alarm
 - The Motor Oil that was discovered in the Wet Well when responding to a High Water alarm was released to the floor of the pump station during the maintenance of the alarm. This release of Motor Oil was now considered a Hazardous Waste Spill. Franc Environment was contacted to address the Hooker Street Pump Station floor Hazardous Waste Spill and to capture the clean-up water for treatment. The Sump Pump for the station discharges directly back into the Wet Well. An Emergency Statement was issued for the cleanup. [The Emergency Statement is attached for review].
- 10. Pump #1 for Pump Station #2 rebuild was awarded to Willier Electric. The pump has not returned from the repairs as of the writing of this report.
- 11. Grit Chamber #1 [The NJDEP out of service case # is 170411125541] is still out of service as of the writing of this report. There was an issue founded with the Drive Chain Gear. The gear is not the correct gear for Grit Chamber #1. The gear that was sent is for Grit Chamber #2. A new 10 T Sprocket for Grit Chamber #1 was ordered from Sherwood Logan.
- 12. The conveyor parts required to rebuild Grit Conveyor #2 were received from Pyrz. Three quotations will be requested for the repairs when Grit Chamber #1 is returned to service.
- 13. Environmental Resolutions, Inc. (ERI) was directed to notify C. Stevenson & Son their quotation for the retrofit of the Confined Space Retrieval System for Hooker Street Pump Station was accepted and a Purchase Order was issued. The retrofit was not started as of the writing of this report.

- 14 Pennoni requested the DRBC for an extension for the submission of the 2017 Annual PMP Plan Report for Friday March 30, 2018 due to data not yet received from QC/Eurofins. The final PCB Congener CD for 2017 was received May 1, 2018 from QC/Eurofins. A copy of the CD was made for Pennoni Associates review and mailed. Also a copy of the CD was mailed to the DRBC for review.
- 15. The Annual Confine Space Training with the Cinnaminson Rescue Team was conducted April 24, 2018 at the Hooker Street Pump Station. All Plant Personal were in attendance, accept for the personal working the Treatment Plant.
- 16. The First Quarter Commercial Usage Meter Reading has been submitted to the Town Hall.
- 1" The Hooker Street Pump station encountered a Power Outage May 5, 2018. The Portable Generator for the station was connected and there was no disturbance in the conveyance of the wastewater. PSEG restored the power to the station after seven hours of troubleshooting. The station is now operating as designed.

ACTIVITIES REPORT April/May 2018

Routine maintenance was performed on the Hooker Street Pump Station. A piece of a PVC Lateral Vent Cap was found in the discharge check valve. The Station will not operate as designed. Willier Electric was contacted to trouble shoot the issue.

The Property Owner for 24 Scott Street was issued a letter requiring the owner to address the damaged lateral vent cap for the property. The Township Administrator and the Authority's Secretary received a copy of the letter.

Willier Electric found a faulty Auxiliary Starter for Pump 2 at Hooker Street Pump Station, which was replaced. The Station is now operating as designed.

Joe D. stayed for overtime to process sludge with the Belt Filter Press.

The First Quarter Commercial Usage Meter Reading has been submitted to the Town Hall.

Contech and an associate for Pennoni Engineer were onsite to troubleshoot the issue with the SCADA and the dialer.

Maintenance was performed on the Drain Line for the Primary Digester. A blockage was removed and the drain line is now operating as designed.

The valve for the Drain Line for the Primary Digester was replaced. The valve stem was damaged. The valve is now operating as designed.

Training on how to rebuild a Gate Valve was conducted with the Plant Employees.

Pictures of the old Mixer Feed Lines were emailed to Pennoni Engineers as requested.

ERI was notified by email that Stevenson and Son were awarded the Hooker Street Davit Retrofit project.

The SED Monthly Report and the SED Quarterly Procurement Report were emailed.

Joe Henry returned all the Cintas Uniforms.

Maintenance on the Primary Digester Gas Line was performed. Heavy corrosion was found in the line and the valves.

The filling the Primary Digester with the Plant's Effluent for New Roto Mixer test run has been started.

A valve for the Primary Digester Gas Line was removed for maintenance.

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Pennoni Engineers was emailed about the new Digester Roof leaking. I was informed by Pennoni Associates that Clyde Lattimer & Son Construction will submit a Change Order to make the repairs to the roof.

The Plumbing Inspector was onsite enquiring if we inspected a lateral repair for 311 Fairview Street. He was informed we did not.

Pennoni Engineers have been informed the Primary Digester was full of Plant Effluent and was ready for the Roto Mixer representative testing.

Joe B's Financial Disclosure Statement has been submitted.

The Safety Boots for the employees has been ordered as per the contract from Carl's Shoes.

The Certified Letter Receipt for 24 Scott Street was received April 16, 2018. 24 Scott Street signed the receipt April 13, 2018. The Property Owners has seven days to confirm to the letter's request for the repair of the properties lateral vent.

Willier Electric was onsite to remove the Pump Station #2, Pump #1 for rebuild. A spare pump was installed until the pump returns from the rebuild.

Ed B. Plumbing was onsite to replace the leaking Hot Water Heater for Building 1. The install was completed and the Hot Water Heater is operating as designed.

Repairs to Carter Pump #1 were performed. The stroke of the Piston was increased and the shear pin was replaced. The pump is now operating as designed.

A new 10 T Sprocket for Grit Chamber #1 was ordered from Sherwood Logan.

The maintenance of the Primary Digester Gas Line valves was continued. Maintenance is not complete.

WEF was contacted once again about over charging an employee for their membership. There has been no response from the WEF representative. Town Hall was instructed to just pay the normal rate for an Operator.

Training on how to obtain a CAS identifier from the NJDEP and SDS verification was conducted with the Plant Employees.

Training on how to obtain a Certificate of Analyses from Hach was conducted with the Plant Employees.

Collection Maintenance was performed on the Paine Street sewer main.

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April 18, 2018 the Township Administrator was notified 24 Scott has not made the required repairs. The Property Owner had until April 20, 2018 to do so. The Township Administrator informed me the Township Inspector will notify the Property Owner the repairs need to be completed or the owner will receive fines from the Township.

An emergency condition existed at the Hooker Street Pump Station April 23, 2018. Employees discovered a good amount of Motor Oil on top the Wet Well when responding to a High Water Alarm. The NJDEP Case # is 180423151214. The NJDEP Southern Enforcement Inspector was also notified.

Franc Environment was contacted to address the Hooker Street Pump Station floor Hazard Waste Spill and to capture the clean-up water for treatment. The Motor Oil that was discovered in the Wet Well when responding to a High Water alarm was released during the maintenance of the alarm. An Emergency Statement was issued for the cleanup.

The Annual Confine Space Training with the Cinnaminson Rescue Team was conducted April 24, 2018 at the Hooker Street Pump Station. All Plant Personal were in attendance.

A representative for the supplier of the Primary Digester Roto Mix system was onsite to monitor the pre Startup Test run. The Mixing system performed as designed.

The Primary Digester will now receive raw primary sludge for the second Startup Test. Once the digester has sludge, the representative for the supplier of the Primary Digester Roto Mix system will return and the system will be started in preparations of the second startup testing.

New employee Brandon Johnston started April 24, 2018.

New employee Robert Chamberlain started April 30, 2018.

The representative for the supplier of the Primary Digester Roto Mix system was onsite and the system was started in preparations of the second startup testing.

The final PCB Congener CD for 2017 was received from QC/Eurofin. A copy of the CD was made for Pennoni Associates review and mailed. Also a copy of the CD was mailed to the DRBC for review.

The RTR for March 2018 was emailed to the County.

The Hooker Street Pump station encountered a Power Outage May 5, 2018. The Portable Generator for the station was connected and there was no disturbance of conveyance of wastewater. PSEG restored the power to the station after seven hours of troubleshooting. The station is now operating as designed.

EMERGENCY STATEMENT: HOOKER STREET PUMP STATION OIL SPILL

The undersigned Department Head certifies as to the following:

- 1. An emergency condition exists at the Hooker Street Pump Station.
- 2. This condition constitutes an emergency affecting the immediate health, safety or welfare of the public.
- 3. April 23, 2018 a high water alarm for the Hooker Street Pump Station was received at 0437. RSA was dispatched to investigate the high water level alarm and immediately identified motor oil that was illegally dumped into the Collection System entering the Pump Station. During the investigation, motor oil was spilled and contaminated the Pump Station floor. The floor of the station now requires cleaning, therefore RSA contacted Franc Environmental Services to perform the cleanup, remove the oil and properly dispose of the contaminated waste.
- 4. This emergency occurred on April 23, 2018 and will continue until such time as the motor oil is removed from the stations floor.
- 5. It is necessary to invoke N.J.S.A. 40a:11-6 in order to obtain the cleanup, remove the oil and properly dispose of the contaminated waste. The estimate cost of this cleanup is \$2,500.00 to \$4,000.00.
- 6. It is requested that purchase orders be issued without public advertisement for bids, pursuant to the above cited statute and N.J.A.C. 5:34-6.1 et seq.
- 7. I certify that the foregoing statements made by me are true. I am aware that if any of the foregoing statements are willfully false, I am subject to punishment.
