DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY:

Chief Tursi reported the Police Activity for June 2011: Investigations – 125, Adult Arrests Total – 87, Motor Vehicle Summons – 234, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 9, Juvenile Charges – 5, Curfew Violations – 0, Protective Custody – 1, Domestic Violence Cases – 15, Summons for False Alarms – 1, False Alarm Calls - 22. A copy of the report is on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

Mayor Conard reported the Delran Emergency Squad Activity for June 2011: Medical Emergencies -70, Motor Vehicle Accidents -4, Fire Stand Bys -7, Non Emergency Transports -1, Patients transported to the hospital -59 and Patients refused treatment and transportation -15.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS:

Mr. Van Meter stated that Mr. March will give the report. Mr. March reported that the Public Works Department has been performing road maintenance throughout the Township, picked up branches throughout the Township, and started picking up bags of grass on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of the month. Friday morning sweeps are continuing. The Department cut grass all at Township parks, lots and ball fields. The Department has begun hauling leaf compost to Delanco's compost site. The

activities for August 2011 were reported. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

Administrator Jack stated that any bags that are left at the curb need to be filled with grass only. If residents have bags that are comingled with other debris, the bags will be picked up and the resident will be charged a fee for pick up because they did not following the Township procedures. Administrator Jack requested that the residents read all materials that are sent to them by the Township.

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND FINANCE:

Mr. Prisco reported that the third quarter property tax payments are due August 1st. However, the County Tax Board has not yet struck a tax rate and once they do the Township Tax Office will print and mail the tax bills. Property owners will have twenty – five days from the date of mailing to pay the third quarter taxes. If the third quarter taxes are paid later than the 25th date after the mailing, interest will be calculated back until August 1st. The fourth quarter is due on November 1st.

DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION:

Mrs. Hatcher reported that Riverside Youth Athletic Association had a large turnout for their tournament.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EVENTS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:

Mrs. Hatcher reported on the upcoming September 11th parade and service. Mrs. Hatcher has been working with the Chief of the Fire Company. Invitations were sent to Delran, Beverly, Delanco, Riverton, Palmyra and Cinnaminson Fire Companies, Emergency Squad and Public Officials. The parade will start at Bridgeboro and Washington Streets, down Bridgeboro Street onto Scott Street and end at the Riverside Fire Company where there will be a Memorial Service. Also, the Teicher Organization has come to an agreement with Ryan Homes for the development of two lots. One of the lots is at Taylor and Kossuth Streets. Thirty one townhomes will be built starting at \$179,900.00.

Mr. Prisco questioned what time the September 11th parade will begin. Mrs. Hatcher answered that it will begin at 4:00pm.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT:

Solicitor Saponaro reported on correspondence that was received on municipal derivatives, public assembly and that there has been no response from Delran Township regarding the drainage issue.

CLERK - COLLECTOR'S REPORT:

Municipal Clerk/Deputy Tax Collector Dydek reported that the Real Estate Tax Collection Status as follows: Prior Year -99.96%, Current Year -97.02% and Next Year -0%.

Municipal Clerk Dydek reported that she submitted a written report to the Committee. Mrs. Dydek reported that 660 dog licenses have been issued and 54 cat licenses have been issued. Michele Roy and Mike Wasco were hired as Animal Census Control Officers. A report of non-renewals was sent to the Animal Control Officer on July 1, 2011 so that summons may be issued.

Municipal Clerk/Registrar Dydek reported the Vital Statistic Report for the second quarter of 2011 as follows: Number of people applying for Birth Certificates – 35, Marriage Certificates – 20, Death Certificates – 0, Domestic Partnership Certificates – 0, Civil Union Certificates – 0, Marriage Licenses – 20, and Civil Union Licenses – 0. Also, Births of Riverside Residents – 18, and Deaths of Riverside Residents – 15.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Mayor Conard asked the Committee if there were any questions regarding the Engineer's Report that was submitted. No questions were presented. A copy of the report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's office.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

Administrator Jack reported on the Phase V Reconstruction of Filmore, Taylor and Kossuth Street Project. There was a meeting with the residents and it was well attended. Willingboro Township will begin the inlet work on Thursday July 28, 2011. The 2012 CASA Grant Application has been submitted. Also, a church has been granted occupancy at 46 Scott Street. They will also occupy 42 Scott Street as a fitness studio.

Mrs. Hatcher questioned if there is any leftover materials from the paving of Weeks Avenue, could be laid near Holly Day School to help with the condition of the street. Administrator Jack answered in the affirmative. Mr. March stated that the Public Works Department was in the area of Holly Day School last week patching the street and the men were being harassed by the property owners because the men were patching the street. Mrs. Hatcher questioned if the people that were complaining were from the school or if they resided on Fairview Street. Mr. March stated it was the school. Administrator Jack stated that she will consult with the Engineer regarding this issue and contact Holly Day School.

RENTAL INSPECTOR'S REPORT:

The Rental Inspector's report has been distributed. Mayor Conard questioned if the Committee had any inquiries. No inquiries were presented. Mayor Conard stated that there are many properties listed on the report however, there are not many violations. PUBLIC PORTION

- 1) Mr. & Mrs. Adrian Frio 513 Cleveland Avenue stated their concerns and displeasure over the company Affordable Waterproofing which is located near their home. Mr. and Mrs. Frio stated that Affordable Waterproofing is storing trash, tools and other materials in the building behind the Frios' home. (There is a garage/building/warehouse that is owned by Affordable Waterproofing that is located on the property in back of the Frios' residence. There is an easement on the use of the driveway which is on the Frios' property that would allow Affordable Waterproofing to get to the warehouse). Affordable Waterproofing has constructed scaffolding that is not attached to a building for support and there is material stored on it. There is stucco residue all over their pavement. Also, they produce much noise that happens early in the morning most of the time. Mr. and Mrs. Frio questioned the zoning of the property. Administrator Jack stated that the Planning Board Solicitor is currently reviewing the parameters for the business. Administrator Jack stated that the property is located in a R2 Zone and it was a subdivision approved for a commercial use such as a salon or an office. The property is in violation of property maintenance however, there is not enough room there for a dumpster. The scaffolding must be removed. There was a brief discussion on the noise ordinance by the Township Committee. Mrs. Frio informed the Committee that the owners of the property told Officer Nolan that the back - up beepers on the vehicles would be disengaged as this would help with the noise problem. The beepers are still working in the trucks, they have not been disengaged. Mrs. Frio stated that this company has many issues with the neighbors. Administrator Jack suggested that all the parties involved try mediation as this might resolve the problem. Chief Tursi stated that Mr. and Mrs. Frio should bring in copies of their deed and easement to attach to any complaints that they file.
 - 2) Ms. Joan Plowman 507 Cleveland Avenue stated that she agrees with the Frios with concerns over Affordable Waterproofing. Ms. Plowman said that there are many trucks at the property, there is much noise and the company is depreciating the values of the homes in the area. Ms. Plowman stated that she has lived at her address for many years and the warehouse was never used as an industrial site, only for storage. Ms. Plowman stated that there has never been this amount of noise at the properties.
 - 3) Mr. George Perry 438 Delaware Avenue stated his concerns over the scaffolding that is erected at the property owned by Affordable Waterproofing. Mr. Perry stated that the scaffolding is right next to his back yard and he is concerned that it is going to fall into his yard and injure his children

Hearing nothing further from the Public, motion made by Mr. Van Meter and Mrs. Hatcher carried: Public Portion be closed.

There being no further business to attend to, motion made by Mr. Van Meter and Mr. Prisco that the meeting be adjourned, and so declared by Mayor Conard.
