COMMITTEE REPORTS:

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY:

Chief Tursi reported the Police Activity for September 2012: Incidents – 657, Adult Arrests Total – 91, Motor Vehicle Summons – 131, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 11, Juvenile Charges – 5, Curfew Violations – 1, Protective Custody – 0, Domestic Violence Cases – 17, Summons for False Alarms – 1, False Alarm Calls - 10. Chief Tursi reported the various trainings that the Officers attended, the various programs that the officers and the Chief participated in, and various awards and commendations that the police officers received. A copy of the report is on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

Mrs. Hatcher questioned Chief Tursi if the Riverside High School Football Team has played the Palmyra Football Team. Mrs. Hatcher stated that the reason she is asking this is because the last time the Riverside High School Football Team played a football team from a town that is located on the Light Rail Line, there was a large amount of people on the Light Rail Station. Chief Tursi stated that he is not aware of the football schedule and stated that many people are riding the Light Rail Line and not purchasing tickets because New Jersey Transit Police are not enforcing the purchasing of fares. There was a brief discussion on the policing of the Light Rail Line.

Mayor Conard reported the Delran Emergency Squad Activity for September 2012: Medical Emergencies – 82, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 8, Fire Stand Bys – 4, Non Emergency Transports – 0, Football Standbys – 4, Patients transported to the hospital – 73, Patients refused treatment and transportation – 17 and Church Festival Standbys - 1.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS:

Mr. March reported that the Public Works Department performed road maintenance throughout the Township, chipped branches every Monday and Friday (the last pick-up will be October 26th), cut the grass at all parks and Township owned lots and ball fields. The Department is still working on periodic yard clean up at the DPW yard. The activities for November 2012 were reported. Mr. Prisco questioned what should residents do if they have brush after October 26th? Mr. March answered that he would prefer if they keep the brush at their properties until the next brush pick up. Mr. March explained that if residents bring the brush to the DPW yard, there is not enough manpower to chip the brush. There was a discussion on the collection of leaf pick - up and whether or not the leaves should be bagged or put out on the curb. It was determined that in the Fall, the leaves should be placed at the curb. Administrator Jack stated that leaf pick – up will be monitored. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND FINANCE:

Mr. Van Meter reported that the Real Estate Tax Collection Status as follows: Prior Year – 99.96%, Current Year –75.56% and Next Year – 0.26%. Mr. Van Meter also reported that the fourth quarter tax bills are due on November 1st and interest will accrue on November 13th (this is because the 10th of November is on a Saturday and the 12th of November the Tax Office will be closed in honor of Veteran's Day).

Mrs. Hatcher requested that Administrator Jack report on Community Day. Administrator Jack reported that Community Day was a success although the turn – out was smaller than previous years.
