The undersigned Department Head certifies as to the following:

1. An emergency condition exists in the wastewater collection system.
2. This condition constitutes an emergency affecting the immediate health, safety or welfare of the public.
3. The control panel at Hooker St. pump station went down. The panel was outdated and was unable to repaired. A new panel and probes were purchased and installed at the pump station.
4. This emergency occurred on the week of May 9, 2022. Final repairs were made on May 12, 2022.
5. It is necessary to invoke N.J.S.A. 40a:11-6 in order to obtain the immediate replacement of said Water Line. The estimate cost of said parts is \$8,000 – \$10,000.



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

EMERGENCY STATEMENT: Utility Water Valve Replacement.

The undersigned Department Head certifies as to the following:

1. An emergency condition exists in the wastewater treatment system.
2. This condition constitutes an emergency affecting the immediate health, safety or welfare of the public.
3. The valve on the Utility Water line for the Belt Filter Press was struck by a pallet and broke at floor level. We were unable to isolate the line causing a deluge of water inside Building 6 without turning the pumps off, which are needed to run for our Trickling Filter pumps.
4. This emergency occurred on May 25, 2022. Final repairs were made on May 26, 2022.
5. It is necessary to invoke N.J.S.A. 40a:11-6 in order to obtain the immediate replacement of said Water Line. The estimate cost of said parts is \$15,000 – \$20,000.
6. It is requested that purchase orders be issued without public advertisement for bids, pursuant to the above cited statute and N.J.A.C. 5:34-6.1 et seq.
7. I certify that the foregoing statements made by me are true. I am aware that if any of the foregoing statements are willfully false, I am subject to punishment.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1) Joan Plowman – 509 Cleveland Avenue – Water pouring out. Superintendent Bader reported that the inspection revealed that this is the homeowner’s problem.
- 2) Mr. Hoey – 308 Lippincott Avenue – Sewer backing up. Toilets not flushing. Superintendent Bader reported that the inspection revealed that this is the homeowner’s problem.
- 3) Charles Ercol (Neighbor) – Vent overflowing at 415 Taylor Street. Superintendent Bader reported that the inspection revealed that this is the homeowner’s problem.

INSPECTIONS:

Mr. Horton had no report.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Superintendent Bader reported that the total Suspend Solids Removal Efficiency was not in compliance with the Permit. An investigation into this problem is being conducted. The Plant commonly receives an Influent TS of 200 mg/l or higher. The low Influent TSS percentage affects the TSS Removal Efficiency.

One property was reported to the NJDEP for a lateral vent overflow. That property was 207 Bridgeboro Street.

An emergency condition existed at the Plant with the main water feed line to the Belt Filter Press. Until the line was repaired, no sludge could be processed and it would affect other wastewater processing equipment that was used to treat sewerage. An Emergency Statement was issued for the repairs.

On June 6, 2022, the power supply for the Influent Pump Station Controller failed. The station was operated by hand for thirteen (13) hours until the new power supply was purchased and replaced.

Longo Electric completed the Pneumatic Ejector Controller Installation for the Hooker Street Pump Station. The pump station is now operating as designed.

The Hot Eater Recirculation Pump for the boiler used to heat the Primary Digester Sludge needs repair. To treat the sludge in the Primary Digester properly, the sludge needs to be maintained in a certain temperature range. Four Quarters Plumbing was contacting for the repairs.

1. The Plant Performance Summary for April, 2022 is attached for review. The Total Suspend Solids Removal Efficiency was not in compliance with the Permit. An investigation into this problem is being conducted. The Plant commonly receives an Influent TSS of 200 mg/l or higher. The low Influent TSS percentage affects the TSS Removal Efficiency.

The Residuals [Sludge] Management Summary for April, 2022 is also attached for review. Dewatered sludge [25 yds] were removed by the Seaside Waste Services for composting at the County facility.

2. The Trouble Log Summary for May, 2022 is attached for review.

One Properties was reported to the NJDEP for a lateral vent overflow this reporting period.

a) 207 Bridgeboro Street - NJDEP Case # 220514114944.


3. The Line Maintenance Summary for May, 2022 is attached for review.
4. No measurements were taking for the Secondary Digester Cover tilt during this reporting period.

[The Secondary Digester is not operating as designed. The Secondary Digester Dome requires methane gas produced in the Primary Digester for the secondary roof to float correctly.

5. An emergency condition existed at the wastewater treatment plant with the main water feed line to the Belt Filter Press. Until the line was repaired no Sludge could be processed and would affect other wastewater processing equipment in the Plant to treat sewage. An Emergency Statement was issued for the repairs.
6. Met with Kurk Consultants. Keymar is looking into installing a second lateral for a second bathroom. Kurk Consultants was made aware of the Township and Authority's requirements before any construction can be done. [The Consultant's card is attached for review].
7. June 6, 2022 the Power Supply for the Influent Pump Station Controller failed. The station was operated by hand for thirteen hours until the new power supply was purchased and replaced by RSA. The Controller is now operating as designed.
8. Longo Electric has completed the Pneumatic Ejector Controller install for the Hooker Street Pump Station. The Pump Station is now operating as designed.
9. The Hot Water Recirculation Pump for the Boiler used to heat the Primary Digester Sludge is in need of repair. To treat the sludge in the Primary Digester properly, the sludge needs to be maintained in a certain temperature range. Four Quarters Plumbing was contacted. Waiting on delivery of pump.
10. Sand Filter # 1 has been removed from service for inspection and maintenance. The NJDEP Case # is 211108074550.

N.J.S.A. 10:4-12


