RESOLUTIONS:

Mr. Horton made a motion to adopt Resolution 2025 - #16 entitled, "Resolution 2025 - #16 entitled, "A Resolution of the Riverside Sewerage Authority Authorizing the Salary Increases and Contract Amendments for the Riverside Sewerage Authority Plant Employees" seconded by Mr. Conard carried.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Motion made by Mr. Van Meter, seconded by Mr. Conard that the minutes of the Work Session Meeting of March 10, 2025 and the Regular Meeting of March 10, 2025 be approved. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: Ayes – Messrs. Conard, Giovanetti, Horton, and Van Meter. Nays – None. Abstain – None. Absent - Mr. Mingin. – None. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION 2025 - #16
A RESOLUTION OF THE RIVERSIDE SEWERAGE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING
THE SALARY INCREASES AND CONTRACT AMENDMENTS FOR THE RIVERSIDE
SEWERAGE AUTHORITY PLANT EMPLOYEES.

WHEREAS, the Riverside Sewerage Authority Members held a Closed Session Meeting on December 9, 2024 for the purpose of discussing Contract Negotiations; and

WHEREAS, the Riverside Sewerage Authority discussed and approved annual raises, Standby Rates, Vacation Schedules, additional language to be added/updated to the contract, and language to be removed from the contract.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Chairman and Authority Members of the Riverside Sewerage Authority that the undermentioned language is hereby added and/or amended to the Contract of the Riverside Sewerage Authority Plant Employees:

Annual Raises:

- 2025 -3% increase
- 2026 – 3.5%
- 2027 – 3.5%

Standby Rates:

- Increase to \$20.00 flat rate.

Vacation Schedule:

Change to 5 year increments. The same amount of days will be given, just broken down into five-year increments:

- 1 to 5 years – 12 days
- 6 to 10 years – 15 days
- 11 to 15 years – 20 days
- 20 years and beyond – 25 days.

Add into the contract the following language that was approved by the Authority:

- 50 cents per hour increase for obtaining a CDL License.
- \$5,000.00 dollars for healthcare coverage from the ages of 62 to 65 years upon retirement.

Update the following existing contract language:

- New hires shall be hired at the rate of \$25.00 per hour.
- The Foreperson starting salary shall be \$28.00 per hour.


Language to be removed from the contract:

- Article IV, Section B. #3 – Hiring rates shall be by experience and licensing, however, no new hire, Operator or Laborer shall be hired above the lowest paid current bargaining unit employee of the Riverside Sewerage Authority.
- Article IV, Section B. #11 C. – No one shall be eligible for Foreperson status until he/she holds at least an S-2 and C-1 licenses.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the aforementioned amendments and/or salary increases will be retroactive to January 1, 2025.

Adopted the 14th day of April 2025 by the Riverside Sewerage Authority.



Mr. Giovanetti stated the report will be given in the Superintendent's Report.

APPEALS

Mr. Mingin was not in attendance.

REVENUE AND FINANCE:

Mr. Horton reported that the Treasurer stated that over \$82,000.00 was received during the first quarter billing compared to the first quarter of 2024.

STREETS:

Mr. Van Meter reported that he inspected Greenwood Avenue and it was satisfactory.

INSPECTIONS:

Mr. Conard had no report.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Superintendent Jeffrey Conard reviewed his report that was distributed.

Mr. Horton questioned the bid for the fence. Superintendent Conard reported that the Authority received a quote of \$33,000.00 to replace the fence at Monroe Street to the Babe Ruth Field. The fence will be and 8 Ft. black fence. The Township will have a 6 ft. black fence installed for a fee of \$33,000.00. The Superintendent tried to obtain three (3) quotes however, the only contractor to show up was Four Star Fence. The other contractors did not show to give an estimate.

Superintendent Conard reported that he is moving forward with the heating for the garage. Requested to go out to bid. The Authority agreed. Mr. Horton suggested to contact the person who fixed the boilers at the fire house.

Pennoni Engineer Tom Leisse suggested that the plant utilize the Evoqua Davco Retrofit & Rehab services for the plant upgrade.

Superintendent Conard further reported that he is moving forward with the membranes. However, something must be done with the suspended solids. They started injecting Poly Aluminum Chloride in the influent well of the flocs to assist with the suspended solids settling out. This will assist in keeping the UVT number above 43 which is the lowest number for our UV System to function properly.

The Chemical Pump is not operating as designed. Looking for pumps through PSI. Using a pump from Grainger.

Upcoming Construction – Hooker Street Pump Station - Moving from Metal Works Station to the Hooker Street Pump Station. Redoing the bar screen, will take the building down and make it a wet well. The controls will be moved outside into a cabinet like the metal works.

The press is down this week for repairs.

The report is on file in the Secretary's Office.

Motion made by Mr. Horton, seconded by Mr. Conard, to accept the Superintendent's Report carried.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

The Engineer's Report was distributed. There were no questions or concerns presented.


Mr. Horton said that Pennoni should remove the projects that have been completed.

PLANT OPERATOR'S REPORT
AUTHORITY MEETING - APRIL 14, 2025**

1. The Plant Performance Summary for February, 2025 is attached for review. There was a noncompliance violation during this reporting period with the E-coli. The Residuals [Sludge] Management Summary for February, 2025 is also attached for review. Dewatered sludge [25 yds] were removed by the Seaside Waste Services Company for composting at the County facility.
2. Trouble log for March is attached.
3. Weekly collection system checks were performed in March.
4. No measurements were taking for the Secondary Digester Cover tilt during this reporting period. The Secondary Digester is not operating as designed. The Secondary Digester Dome requires methane gas produced in the Primary Digester for the secondary roof to float correctly.
5. Started injecting Poly Aluminum Chloride in the influent well of the flocs to assist with suspended solids settling out. This will assist in keeping our UVT number above 43 which is the lowest number for our UV system to function properly.
6. Grit Chamber #2 is back in service. Case# 25-02-10-1400-57
7. Still collecting data for our upcoming projects.
8. Received one quote for the replacement of the fence at the plant. Four Star Fence Company was awarded the job.

Superintendent Conard reported that there is a sinkhole at New Jersey and Chester Avenues. There is a plate over it and it is above the main. M&N will take care of this. Treasurer Jack questioned if it is within 300 ft of the signal. Superintendent Conard answered in the affirmative.

There being no further business to attend to, motion made by Mr. Van Meter and Mr. Horton that the meeting be adjourned, and so declared by Chairman Giovanetti.
